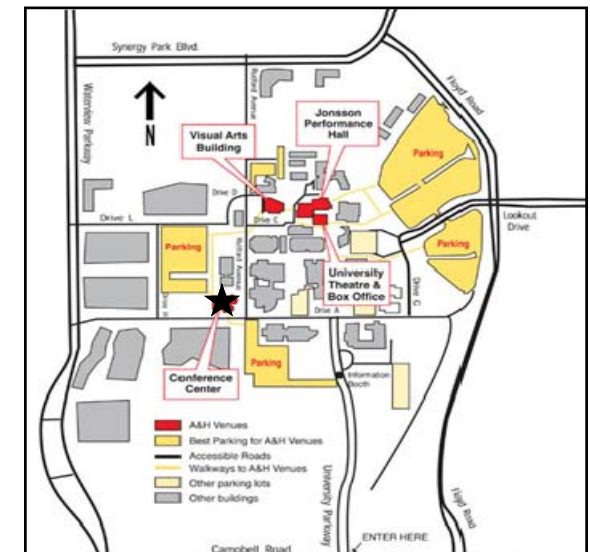
WORKSHOP INFORMATION
