## The Bruzzy Westheimer Graduate Fellowship in Human Security

The purpose of the fellowship is to support outstanding graduate students focusing on human security issues during their graduate studies.

## Criteria:

This fellowship will be awarded to applicants prepared to commit to graduate studies on a full-time basis. No awardee may work more than twenty (20) hours per week, including work as a teaching fellow, a research assistant, or in the College Work study Program (or it successor). For selection purposes, the selection committee shall consider the following information from each applicant:

- 1. Applications will be accepted from graduate students enrolled at, or applying to, the University of North Texas in any discipline, but pursuing research and/or scholarly activities related to human security. Graduate students with majors housed in CLASS will be given first priority
- 2. Academic potential for excellence as evidenced by cumulative GPA for the 60 hours preceding application
- 3. Publications, research, scholarly presentations or serving as a teaching assistant, research assistant, or teaching fellow related to issues related to human security
- 4. A minimum of two letters of recommendation attesting to the integrity and professional/academic potential of the applicant in the area of human security
- 5. Two page essay describing work in Human Security
- 6. Applications for renewal of awards from the fund will be treated the same as first-time applicants, with the Faculty Council having final approval beyond the criteria listed above

The Dean's office will do the scholarship paperwork (AFP, award letters, etc)
